of sudden death and not a cycling accident
in the usual acceptance of the term and that
no one was responsible for it - not even
poor Gorman himself. It was undoubtedly an
aftermath of the war and the injuries he
sustained in doing his bit. Although Gorman
only joined the club three years ago, he had
shown himself to be a real infielder and had
endeared himself to all our hearts. He was
universally beloved and his tragic death
comes as a great shock. To those bereaved we
offer our deepest sympathy, and to mark our
feelings I ask you all to rise in silence."
