This Meeting of the Executive of the ANFIELD BICYCLE CLUB notes
with great interest and satisfaction the references to the dangerous
driving of motor vehicles in Wirral made at the Meeting of the Wirral
Rural District Council held on the 28th April and in every respect
endorses the remarks of Mr. Maurice Jones (as published in the Press)
then made.

This Meeting considers Mr. Maurice Jones's statements not to be
exaggerated in the slightest and is of opinion that the time has
arrived for the initiation of steps of the most drastic and emphatic
nature calculated to put an immediate stop to the reckless and dangerous
driving which is rampant not only in Wirral but throughout the Country,
as is evidenced by the fact that on three recent and successive week-
ends no fewer than eight Members of the Anfield Bicycle Club were
needlessly run down by motorists and on Saturday, May 3rd, one Member
was killed by a motorist, - of these "accidents" only one occurred at
night time.

This Meeting is further of opinion that, while endorsing the
Council's demand for active police action, the remedy does not altogether
lie in that direction; it holds that magistrates, with few exceptions,
are far too lenient in cases of this nature brought before them by the
police and that until the police obtain greater support from this quarter
the scandal cannot but continue.

This Meeting would also draw the particular attention of the
authorities to the cause of many of these "accidents" - the common
practice of motorists in "pushing-through" (or attempting to do so)
between two lines of meeting traffic, often on narrow parts of roads,
to the great danger of all concerned and asks the Police to give particular
attention to this point on the ground that any and every vehicle on the
road - even a cycle - has a right to half the road and that the proper
course for a driver wishing to overtake is to wait until the road is clear
on his off-side.

"SPEED HOGS IN WIRRAL.

POLICE CRITICISED.

STRONG PROTEST BY WIRRAL RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

The annual meeting of the Wirral Rural District Council was held on Monday week, when there was a good attendance of members.

DANGEROUS DRIVING.

The Clerk of the Highways Committee reported that the Caldy Parish Council had notified that they considered that motor cars and motor cycles were driven in a dangerous manner through the village, and suggesting that two notice boards be put up at either end "Drive slowly through the village".

Mr. Maurice Jones said this was a good opportunity to call the attention of the authorities to the dangerous driving by motor vehicles which was going on in the district of Wirral. During the past week his health had been endangered by having to walk along the high roads and only recently he saw a little dog killed in Barnston on the Birkenhead road. It appeared to him that the owners of motor cars and cycles thought they had the right to hold the road. He referred particularly to the neighbourhood of the Glegg Arms to Woodchurch, and from there to Chester. Their whole idea seemed to be to go in for excessive scorching and their sole aim in life to pass each other. The roads were not wide enough for this excessive speed. There was not enough vigilance exercised on the part of the police. On Easter Monday there was not a policeman to be seen along that particular neighbourhood. He and his wife had been pushed into a ditch several times to make way for motor cyclists. They had no regard for anyone else on the road and had no regard for the safety of the people. He moved that a letter be sent to the police from the Council, asking them to exercise control over the high-roads and to have more vigilance on the traffic that passes through, especially at week-ends.
