Centre Medal, Standard 'E' a Small Gold Medal &
Standard 'F' a Large Gold Medal, thus abolishing a
Special Large Gold Standard, saving about one third

This will make an alteration in Prize Rule 4.
Prize Rule 4. That the N. R. R. A. Gold Medal value be
