SUGGESTED RULES

- (1). The Championship is open to all cadets who will not have attained the age of seventeen years on September 30th., 1961.
- (2). Riders must submit an Entry Form to the Machine Secretary not later than ~~14~~ 14 days before each event. In addition to details of previous performances the exact age of the rider must be stated.
- (3). Every event will be handicapped from a scratch time of 25 minutes.
- (4). A standard allowance of handicap, based on age, will be given to all riders who have not previously finished in an event. This will be:-

$$\begin{array}{r} \text{AGE} \\ 14 \\ 15 \\ 16 \end{array} = \begin{array}{r} 5 \\ 3 \\ 2 \end{array} \text{ min allowance.}$$

- (5). Three awards will be made based on the total time of the three best handicap performances by a rider during the season.
